#### **About FCC**

Falkirk Camera Club (FCC) was initially established in 1889 under the name of Falkirk Amateur Photographic Association which brought together keen enthusiasts at the dawn of photography.

Since then the club has taken various names and finally adopted the current title in 1958. More on the history of the club can be found on the club website.

Falkirk Camera Club became a registered charity on 7<sup>th</sup> November 2022

#### **Our Club Night**

FCC meet on a Thursday evening between September and April within the historic Falkirk Trinity Church.

Our weekly club meeting night usually involves a guest speaker or welcoming an experienced judge to pass comments on images taken and entered into our club competitions.

We also run workshops or tutorials and have various member nights through the year. Our management team is also active in arranging outings or get togethers in various locations to take photographs as part of a group. These sessions often run on weekends or evenings outside the main club night and continue, often weekly, while the club is on a break through the summer months.

As a member of FCC you are welcome to join us on any of these events.

All events are published on social media and on our website and if we have your email you will also receive a weekly newsletter publicising our events and telling you what is coming up.

The meeting starts at 7:30pm but the cafe area is open from 7pm for you to grab a cup of tea/coffee and have a catch up with other members. Meetings usually conclude by 9:30pm

#### **Subscriptions**

Membership of Falkirk Camera Club is by annual subscription rate. This rate is set by members at our Annual General Meeting which all members are encouraged to attend.

#### The current rate is £90

There are no additional charges throghout the year for attending any of the syllabus nights. All Tea/Coffee and catering is included. We have approx 30 club nights in our club season. During the summer (off season) activities normally contine and involves a weekly meetup (approx 20 nights) and your membership covers these activities as well.

On occasions there may be a small additional nominal charge outwith normal club activities to cover costs such as studio hire, model costs, excursions, workshops etc.

FCC pays an annual affiliation to the Scottish Photographic Federation (SPF) which in return is affiliated to the Photographic Alliance of Great Britain (PAGB). FCC is also affiliated with the Glasgow District Photographic Union (GDPU) and the Falkirk Arts Network (FAN). As a member of FCC you also have the benefits of being members of these groups as well as the Fédération Internationale de l'Art Photographique (FIAP)

#### **Constitution & Governance**

FCC is governed by our constitution a copy of which is available on our website. We also have a Code of Conduct which we ask all members to adhere too.

FCC is a welcoming club and well respected and we ask all our members to treat each other, visiting guests and anyone you come into contact with, as a member of FCC, with dignity and respect.

FCC is a safe space for our members and our guests.

#### Constitution & Governance contd.

As a registered charity FCC is governed by Trustees and a Management Team. The Trustees are normally the President, General Secretary and Treasurer.

The Trustees and Management Team oversee the day to day running of the club and meet monthly throughout the season. The Management Team consists of our Vice-President, Syllabus Secretary, Membership Secretary, Web Controller, PR Secretary, Internal and External Competition Secretaries as well as 3 non role specific posts. The Trustee Roles and Management Team roles are defined on our website.

Members are encouraged to get involved in helping run the club when they feel comfortable to assist. Normally we ask for volunteers at the AGM but you can assist us at any time of the season.

#### Competitions

FCC has regular internal and external competitions during the season and all members are encouraged to take part. The competitions are a way to acheive constrictive critiques of your images from qualified and respected photography judges. However like all things in life opinions may differ and you may not agree with a judges comments. Even between judges, one judge may love your image and score it highly another may not.

Photography is a very personal matter and ulimately it is your thoughts on your photographs that is important. If you like and enjoy your images who is anyone to tell you anything different.

It is up to you to decide if you wish to listen to or ignore the critique. To take on the suggestions or not. A good judge should be fair but constructive..

#### Competitions contd.

Our competitions are normally split into 2 categories Digital also known as PDIs (Projected Digital Images) and Print.

Please just ask if you are unsure of anything.

#### **Competitions (Digital)**

All competitions are open to all our members. New members may prefer to start entering the Digital competitions first as they are the simplest to enter and there is no additional cost with printing images and no images to drop off.

#### **Competitions (Print)**

There is nothing more satisfying than seeing your images in print. We are so used to having images only viewable on a computer or a phone we sometimes forget the beauty of prints.

You do not need to print your own images, commercially produced prints are more than acceptable and sometimes cheaper when you consider ink costs.. These can be ordered online or printed by taking your images to a company. There are several companies that offer printing services with various prices. Some offer discounts. Speak to other members to see who they use.

Presentation of prints are important and they need to be mounted on to a board. This can be a window mount or simply stuck to a piece of artboard. Window mounts do look the best. You can buy pre-cut mounts or have a company mount them for you. We also run mounting workshops occasionally in the club.

The maxium size of a mounted print is 50cm x 40cm. These are then dropped off at a club night.


We use a simple software programme to manage all the competition entries and image uploads.

#### **Photoentry**


We use an application called **Photoentry** to manage all our competition and image uploads. This includes Prints and PDIs

All members will be given free access to the software. The software is very simple to use and full instructions can be given


You will eventually be presented with a series of screens to upload your images

#### **Image Resizing**

Photoentry will resize images, however for best results we recommend you provide images no bigger than 1600px wide and 1200px high.

Most software programs allow you to resize images when they are exported. Always save this as a separate resized image and keep your original intact.

#### **Image Resizing**



Your image can never be wider than 1600 px or taller than 1200 px it can be anything up to these maximums.

The following popular photo editors demonstrate the best way to export your images at an appropriate size. Always save your original and create a copy of the new size.


Most software programs will have a similar process.

#### **Image Resizing**

#### **Adobe Lightroom**


Select the image you wish to export and go to File>Export

This will open the export dialogue box. You can choose where to save it and give it a new name.



Scroll down to the file settings and choose JPG and a colour space of sRGB.

Further down there will be a box that says 'Image sizing" select 1600 x 1200 and pixels or 1200 x 1600 depending on landscape or portrait format.




And finally 'Export' to save.

#### **Image Resizing**

#### **Adobe Photoshop**

Choose File>Export>Export As

This will open the export as dialogue box.



Choose the format JPG.

Image Size 1200 height or 1600 Width (photoshop will keep the image ratio)

Make sure 'Convert to SRGB' and 'Embed Color Profile" are ticked.

Finally click Export. This will open up your save dialogue where you can give the file a name.
