Privacy & Data Protection Policy

Falkirk Camera Club, otherwise referred to as the Club, is committed to protecting the privacy of our members and visitors to our club and website. The club is established with the objectives set out in its Constitution to serve its members. Falkirk Camera Club is a Data Controller.

Personal Information Collected

When you become a member of the club the following personal information may be collected :name, distinctions, contact details, affiliations, service records, records of entries to events and
such other information as may be necessary for the effective management of the legitimate
interests of Falkirk Camera Club only.

Falkirk Camera Club may hold personal information for anyone contacting the Club, or whom the Club contacts for the purpose of conducting its general business.

Any individual wishing to verify, correct or remove their personal information held by the Club may apply to the General Secretary.

How we use your personal information

Falkirk Camera Club collects and uses personal information for several purposes.

- To maintain Membership Records detailing Name, Address, Telephone Numbers, Email Address, Amount of Annual Subscription fees paid, Amount of Workshop fees paid, Amount and Details of other fees paid.
- To invite entries to Club, Inter Club and National Competitions & Salons and relay information and results of same.
- To invite participation in Workshops, Club Exhibitions and Events.
- To circulate the Club Newsletter to members and others. The Newsletter contains editorial and photographs. It may include contact details of anyone who has submitted material for inclusion. The Newsletter is also published on the Club website and is viewable by anyone.

Record Retention

General business records may be held by the Club indefinitely.

Historical archives may be held by the club indefinitely and aspects of the information held may be contributed to the Falkirk District history archive held securely by Falkirk Community Trust, this would not include personal contact details but may identify an individual by name.

Disclosure of your information

Other than previously stated for archival purposes the information you provide to us will not be given or passed on by us to any third party companies or organisations who may use that information to advertise services to you. Your contact information may be given to providers of events, workshops run by the club but only with your express permission and for the purposes of providing information or access to said event.

Cookies

Cookies are small amounts of information which may be stored on your computer. They make it easier for you to log on to and use websites during future visits. They also allow some websites to monitor website traffic and to personalise the content of their sites for you.

When visiting the club website the following caching cookies will be applied.

Your rights

You have rights in respect of your information as follows:

- Right to have your personal data rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete
- Right to be forgotten, i.e. to request the deletion or removal of your personal data from our records
- Right to data portability, i.e. to have a copy of your data in a form that you can move, copy or transfer from one IT environment to another
- · Right to block or suppress the processing of your personal data
- · Right to object to processing of your personal data.
